## Experience Music Project



Located in the shadow of the Space Needle, Experience Music Project (EMP) provides dynamic, multifaceted, ever-changing experiences through new and exciting explorations of American popular music. EMP is a one-of-a-kind music museum combining interactive and interpretive exhibits to tell the story of the creative, innovative and rebellious expression that defines American music. Featuring a world-class collection of artifacts, unique architecture by Frank O.

Gehry, state-of-the-art technology, and exciting interactive presentations, EMP encourages visitors of all ages and backgrounds to experience the power and joy of music in its many forms.

Exploring and celebrating musical diversity is what EMP is all about. Whether your preference is blues, jazz, hip-hop, funk, punk, pop, country or rock 'n' roll, you'll find something here that strikes a chord. You don't need to be a rock star to appreciate EMP, but you might leave feeling like one.

## Museum of Flight

Experience an out-of-this-world event at the largest air and space museum on the West Coast. The Museum of Flight makes the wonder of flight accessible through an outstanding collection of more than 150 historically significant air and spacecraft, interactive exhibits, virtual reality simulators and hands-on activities.



Dramatically lit at night, the Great Gallery is a stunning architectural achievement. The six-story glass and steel structure gracefully suspends more than 20 full-size aircrafts from its ultra-modern frame. Mingle among some of the world's most significant airplanes, including a replica of the first Boeing aircraft, a World War II Corsair and the famous Blackbird spyplane. In all, more than 40 aircrafts from Aviation's Golden Age to the Space Age are on display.

## Space Needle



Seattle Center is a park-like setting created for the 1962 World's Fair and home to Seattle's most famous landmark, the Space Needle. The ever-changing and breathtaking views of Seattle and the surrounding areas add an exciting backdrop to any event. The lofty panorama of Seattle's natural wonders is a sight to be seen; snow-capped Mt. Rainier to the south, the Cascade Mountains to the east, and the majestic Olympics and sparkling Elliott Bay to the west. Fine food, superior service and only-at-the-Space Needle views will elevate your event experience.

## Kiana Lodge

For a true Northwest experience, enjoy a scenic cruise through Puget Sound followed by a delicious salmon dinner. Kiana Lodge was originally built in the 1930s as a clubhouse for Seattle area residents seeking a summer escape. In 1944, the lodge was purchased by a private party and was given the name Kiana which means "Garden of the Gods" in the Suquamish Native American language. Upon arrival, explore this lush setting filled with tall firs, fragrant cedars and colorful flowers. Stroll along the sandy beaches which are carpeted by white clam shells and delicate sand dollars. The perfect ending to this memorable evening is the magnificent nighttime view of the glittering Seattle skyline on the return cruise.



## The Triple Door



The Triple Door was once the Embassy Theatre, a vaudeville and motion picture house constructed in 1926. Guests will see a remembrance of the old Embassy in the theatre's ceiling and proscenium, restored with the original classic motifs. Today, The Triple Door is a contemporary club perfect for a hip crowd. This 8,000 square foot showplace offers a dramatic, yet relaxed environment for guests. Unobstructed views of the stage and generous spacing are achieved by terracing booths and tables on four levels.

## Chateau Ste. Michelle Winery

Situated on the same latitude as the French wine country, Washington State has a growing wine industry that is winning prestigious awards throughout the world. Chateau Ste. Michelle is located on 87 wooded acres that were once part of the "Hollywood Farm" estate of Seattle lumber magnate Fred Stimson. Many of Stimson's original buildings still stand on the property, including his beautiful Manor House. Chateau Ste. Michelle is the ideal setting for a traditional dining experience; there are many rooms with fabulous attributes including a spacious library and separate reception room – each offering attractive hardwood floors and an impressive fireplace.



## Novelty Hill | Januik



Uniting innovation with tradition, Novelty Hill and family-owned Januik are two independent wineries that share a tasting room and production facility. The building's contemporary feel and surrounding landscape celebrate wine's agrarian roots and the artistry of fine winemaking. Distinguished winemaker Mike Januik was recently named one of the world's 10 "Masters of Merlot" by *Wine Enthusiast* magazine. From an intimate dinner in the Cellar to a seated dinner in the Terrace, a

## The Ruins



The Ruins is a private dining club that boasts the combination four different rooms: The Chocolate Room, The Dining Room, The Ballroom and The Maisonette; creating an ideal event location for up to 200 guests. With a full range of culinary offerings from tea sandwiches to New York steaks, The Ruins prides themselves on preparing food of the finest quality, very simply.

As your group enters this unique and exclusive club, they will be taken by the high-styled, eclectic interior design. This hidden gem is decorated with faux paintings, Venetian columns and arches, elegant and regal furnishings, a lush garden and a breathtaking ballroom.

## Pravda Studios



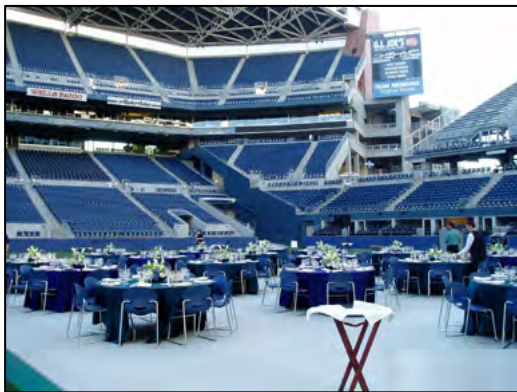
Pravda, Seattle's premier natural light studio space, is located in Seattle's historic Capital Hill neighborhood. ## Safeco Field

## WithinSodo

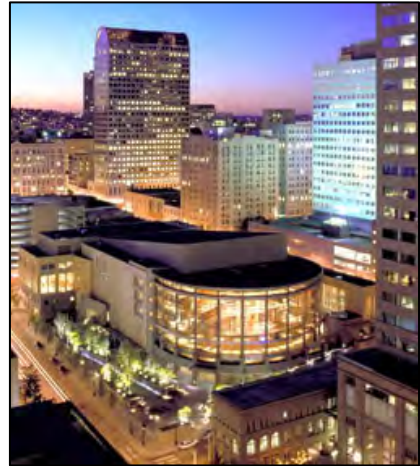

## Urban Enoteca

## Chihuly Garden and Glass Museum

At the foot of the Space Needle, a 44,000 square foot exhibit space for famed glass artist Dale Chihuly will open in the spring of 2012. Attracting an estimated 1,000 visitors per day, this facility will house at least \$50 million worth of Chihuly art and will be open to the public for tours as well as a one-of-a-kind space to hold private events. The 43 foot high glass exhibit space would also include an art garden, restaurant filled with pieces from Chihuly's collection as well as a retail space to sell works including Chihuly's paintings and plates.
